As a result the group, a mixture of band alumni and non-band alumni from the William H Thomas years formed the Edgewater High School Band 1974-1979 Alumni Association, Inc.

One of the missions of this group is to help keep music in our schools by raising money for music related scholarships for Edgewater High School Seniors.

EHSBAA Scholarships for College or Postgraduate Study in Traditional or Traditionally Derived Music

Funds provided to individuals in the form of merit-based scholarships and or need-based scholarships to students enrolled in undergraduate or graduate degree-granting institutions.

These scholarships allow musically talented and or needy individuals to pursue college and university degrees focusing on traditional or traditionally derived music studies at an eligible US educational institution.

Recipients must be pursuing a course of study focusing on traditional or traditionally derived music.

Individual recipients must provide proof of enrollment, grade point average, eligible area studies, and in some cases need-based eligibility. The degree-granting institution must substantiate these criteria upon request. The number and amount of scholarships awarded each year will depend on the net revenues available to the EHSBAA. These scholarship funds can be used for tuition and fees.

Completed Applications must be received by April 15, 2012

Winners will be announced prior to the EHSBAA's Spring Banquet

Supervision of Scholarships

Scholarship awards will be paid directly to the qualified academic institution on behalf of the scholarship award winner. For academic institutions, scholarship grants can only be credited if the student is in good standing with the college or university. If the student fails to enroll in any academic institution for which a scholarship is awarded, The EHSBAA, Inc. will require refund of the scholarship award from the academic institution and/or individual. If the award recipient withdraws from a program after the academic institution's Drop/Add period, The EHSBAA, Inc will pursue any reimbursable funds from the academic institution and then seek a refund for the remainder of awarded funds from the individual grant recipient or parents and/or guardians if the

scholarship is awarded to a minor. No applicant or institution with an unresolved reimbursement to The EHSBAA, Inc. will be eligible for any subsequent funds from the organization.
